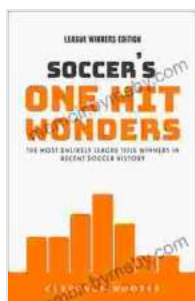

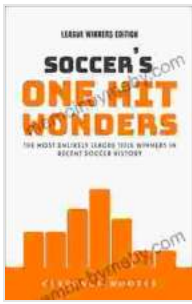
Kaiserslautern (1997-98 Bundesliga)

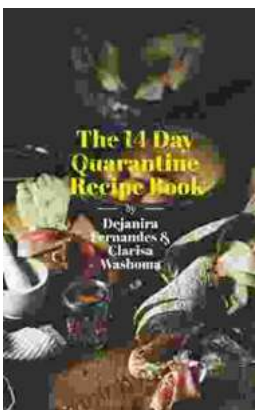
